**Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for April:** We pray for health care workers who serve the sick and the elderly, especially in the poorest countries; may they be adequately supported by governments and local communities.

**Cycle of Prayer:** During the Season of Lent, we pray for: candidates for the sacraments; the needy and hungry of the world; women; survivors of sexual abuse; and penitents and wanderers. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

**Chrism Mass – 13<sup>th</sup> April 2022:** The Chrism Mass will be celebrated in St Barnabas' Cathedral this Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> April, at 11.30 am. **Face Coverings:** HM Government says that face coverings 'can help reduce the chance of you spreading infection to others, especially in crowded and enclosed spaces, and may protect you from becoming infected by some respiratory viruses'. However, there is now no legal obligation to wear face coverings in crowded and enclosed spaces, including in our churches, and the Government is encouraging us to make our own decisions about what is best for us to do. Several parishioners have asked me if this means that they do not have to wear their face covering if they do not want to, and the answer is yes – it is your decision: if you wish to wear a face covering, please feel free to do so; if you do not wish to wear a face covering, please feel free not to – unlike when they were required by law, it is now your choice, and yours alone, to wear a face covering or not. Face coverings are available in the porch for those who would like one, but the stewards will not be offering them or asking you to wear them. In accordance with guidance issued by the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales, those distributing Holy Communion will continue to sanitise their hands immediately before they distribute Holy Communion and will wear a face covering while they distribute Holy Communion. To repeat, for the avoidance of doubt, **you do not have to wear a face covering in our churches if you do not want to, but you can if you do.** Please visit [gov.uk/coronavirus](http://gov.uk/coronavirus) for more information and guidance. **Lenten Breakfasts** conclude in Holy Trinity Parish Hall this Sunday after the Blessing of Palms and Mass at 9.00 am, and **Lenten Lunches** in St Mary's Presbytery this Sunday after the Blessing of Palms and Mass at 11.00 am. Thank you to all who have supported these occasions, by attending and by providing hot cross buns and soup!

**Mass of Thanksgiving for Deacon Richard Jones – 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022:** As you know, Deacon Richard will be leaving us at Easter and he will be assigned to the National Shrine of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Walsingham, in the Diocese of East Anglia; we will celebrate Mass in thanksgiving at 7.00 pm on Easter Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April, followed by a shared table in Holy Trinity Parish Hall; there are sign-up sheets in each church for those who can bring food for the shared table.
