From Pope Francis: 'If we want it to be Christmas, the Birth of Jesus and of peace, let us look at the face of the Child who is born for us! And in that small, innocent face, let us recognise the faces of all those children who long for peace in every part of the world. Today as then, Jesus comes into a world that does not welcome him, that rather rejects or ignores him, as we do so often with foreigners and with the poor. Let's not forget the refugees, the marginalised, people who are alone, orphans and the elderly, prisoners. And if we truly want to celebrate Christmas, let us rediscover awe before a God who becomes little, who is not born in splendour, but in the poverty of a stable. To meet Him, we must go where He is. We must lower ourselves, make ourselves little. Bethlehem shows us God's simplicity, who reveals himself to those with pure and open hearts. Let's allow ourselves to be moved by God's love who became man for our salvation. Let's follow Jesus who stripped himself of his glory so we could share in his fullness. Merry Christmas!'

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for January: We pray that educators may be credible witnesses, teaching fraternity rather than competition and helping the youngest and most vulnerable above all.
