Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for January: We pray that educators may be credible witnesses, teaching fraternity rather than competition and helping the youngest and most vulnerable above all.

Cycle of Prayer: During the winter of Ordinary Time, we pray for: peace on earth; Christian unity; victims of human trafficking; the sick and those who care for them; and the unemployed. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick and housebound of our parish, the staff and pupils of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Blessing Your Home: The Church has a custom of blessing homes during the weeks following the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, using chalk blessed during Mass on the Epiphany and write above the home's door 20 + C + M + B + 23. The letters C, M, B have two meanings: they are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar, and also abbreviate the Latin words Christus mansionem benedicat, which means 'May Christ bless the house'; the '+' signs represent the Cross and 2023 is the current year of Our Lord. Please take some chalk and the prayer to be used as you leave Mass today – you will see that our parish churches have already been blessed! Fr Andrew

Christmas Cribs: This year, our crib offerings will support the Friends of the Holy Land, which helps Christians in Our Lord's earthly homeland, and InterCare, a charity of which Bishop Patrick is patron and whose mission is to save lives and alleviate suffering through their provision of surplus medical resources to rural partner health units in sub-Saharan Africa. The Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick can be received at any time, and should be received by those who are ill — whatever the illness, chronic or acute, mental or physical — or who are preparing for serious surgery. To arrange for me to visit you:

- If you or a relative are in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, please ask a nurse to ask switchboard to contact the chaplaincy and ask for me to visit. If you contact St Mary's Presbytery directly, please have the patient's consent to do so, and provide us with their date of birth and/or address, and which ward they are on; contact for a patient in A&E should always be via the nurse.
- If you or a relative are in other care settings, such as St Andrew's Hospice or a nursing or residential home, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk).
- if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk).

In case of serious illness, please do not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit them in time; similarly, please do not wait until someone is feeling better! All seven sacraments are for the living: Confirmation and the Blessed Eucharist strengthen and renew our Baptism, Holy Orders and Matrimony are sacraments of vocation, and the Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation are sacraments of healing. It is never too early to receive the sacraments, which are God's gracious help for us in the circumstances in which we find ourselves so we should avail ourselves of them. Fr Andrew
