Holocaust Memorial Day - 27th January 2023: On HMD, which marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp, we remember the six million Jews murdered in the Holocaust, and the millions of people killed under Nazi persecution, and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. In the UK, thousands of local events and activities take place every year - each one an opportunity for people to reflect on those whose lives were changed beyond recognition, and to challenge prejudice, discrimination, and hatred in our own society today. The theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2023 is 'ordinary people': through this theme, we are invited to think about all the millions of ordinary victims of Nazi persecution and subsequent genocides and about how easy it is for 'ordinary people' to become perpetrators. In this light, today ordinary people must be alert to the dangers of antisemitism, racism, and intolerance, and strive to combat the evil of genocide in our world.
