The Blessing of Throats is given each year on 3rd February, the Memorial of St Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century, he was a doctor before becoming a Bishop and miraculously cured a boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. His intercession is invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. Orders of Mass have been placed in every copy of *Laudate* so that all who need an Order of Mass for whatever reason do not have to ask stewards for one. Those who do not need one because they know the words are welcome to leave it inside the front cover. The Second Vatican Ecumenical Council teaches us that Since the 'Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy,' and so we should all be taking part in listening to the readings, singing and saying the prayers and reflecting in the silences, because 'such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people" is their right and duty by reason of their Baptism' (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, 14).

St Mary on the Sea Church is currently closed while the porch is restructured, and a toilet constructed with it, and a new lighting scheme installed. The church will reopen next Sunday, 5th February, until when all Masses usually celebrated in St Mary's Church will continue to be celebrated in Corpus Christi Church. There will be no tea and coffee in Holy Trinity Parish Hall this Sunday to facilitate the celebration of both Sunday morning Masses in Corpus Christi Church. Anyone who is free to clean St Mary's Church and prepare it for reopening is welcome to come to the church this Tuesday, 31st January, at 6.00 pm to get hoovering, mopping and tidying – please bring your own mop and bucket! Feast of the Presentation of the Lord – 2nd February 2023: On the fortieth day after his Birth, Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, where he was acclaimed by Simeon as 'a light of revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel' (*Luke* 2:32); we will celebrate his Presentation with the Blessing of Candles and Mass in Corpus Christi Church this Thursday at 10.00 am. The Crib, Christmas trees and the names of those in whose memory donations were received for flowers will be taken down in our three churches after the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which means that this week is everyone's last opportunity to pray before the Crib and to give ,crib offerings will support the **Friends of the Holy Land**, which helps Christians in Our Lord's earthly homeland, and **InterCare**, a charity of which Bishop Patrick is patron and whose mission is to save lives and alleviate suffering through their provision of surplus medical resources to rural partner health units in sub-Saharan Africa.

The Parish Pastoral Council advises and supports me in all aspects of parish life. Members join me outside our churches after Mass whenever possible to say hello, to speak to anyone who wishes to speak to them about any aspects of parish life or to make a note of and pass on information.
