The Ascension of the Lord will be celebrated on Thursday 18th May, the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, and is a holyday of obligation:

Where Christ 'the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope'. The Vigil Mass will be preceded by Eucharistic Adoration at 6.15 pm with Benediction at 6.45 pm, and 1.15 pm Mass in Corpus Christi Church will be attended by Key Stage 2 from both St Mary's and St Joseph's schools.

Coronation of HM King Charles III: We will celebrate the Coronation by saying the Prayer for The King and singing the National Anthem at Mass this weekend. Fr Andrew was born on 8th May 1973, and so tomorrow, Monday 8th May, the Bank Holiday for the Coronation of King Charles III, we will celebrate Mass at 10.00 am in St Mary on the Sea Church, in thanksgiving for the Coronation and Fr Andrew's fiftieth birthday that day; Mass will be followed by brunch and light refreshments in St Mary's Presbytery. All are welcome!

Our Holy Father Pope Francis has given two small segments from among the Relics of the True Cross to the King as a gift for his Coronation, and they have been placed in the Cross of Wales, which was carried in the procession at yesterday's Coronation. This significant gesture by our Holy Father will be greatly appreciated by many as a tangible sign of our real but not yet perfect communion in faith and Baptism, and also our desire, rooted in Christ's prayer at the Last Supper, 'may they all be one' (John 17:21), for full communion as the 'one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church', established by him and subsisting in the Catholic Church. The cross has been given by the King to the Anglican Church in Wales to celebrate its centenary, and it will also be used by the Catholic Church in Wales. Words from the last sermon of St David, Patron of Wales, are inscribed on the back of the cross in Welsh, the ancient British tongue, 'Byddwch iawen. Cadwch y ffydd. Gwnewch y pethau bychain,' meaning, 'Be joyful. Keep the faith. Do the little things' - good advice for us all! May Ss Andrew, George, Patrick and David pray for us! Fr Andrew

Crowning of Our Lady: During each Mass next Sunday, 14th May, Our Lady's statue will be crowned with a garland of flowers to honour 'the Queen of the May'. In May, the month of Our Lady, let us say the Rosary each day to help us meditate on Our Lord's joyful, luminous, sorrowful and mysteries.

The Saint Valentine Bee Club: This Saturday, 13th May, at 11.30 am the Worshipful the Mayor of North East Lincolnshire, Cllr Stephen Beasant, will make an official visit to the apiary to see the bees, meet the beekeepers and learn something of the environmental justice we are promoting as part of our parish's Vision. Bees are essential for our survival – they pollinate much of what we eat and play a critical role in sustaining ecosystems around the world; however, the last decade has been devastating for insect populations, and bees have been hit hard, with populations shrinking by one third in the UK. We can, and must, make a difference – our faith in God, 'Creator of heaven and earth,' demands nothing less.
