Saint Mary on the Sea Church opened 140 years ago this summer, in August 1883; to celebrate this anniversary, we will celebrate Mass in Thanksgiving in St Mary on the Sea Church on Saturday 19th August at 10.00 am. All are welcome.

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated on Tuesday 15th August, and is a holyday of obligation, honouring 'the beginning and image' of the 'Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort' to the pilgrim People of God:

Mon 14th 7.00 pm Vigil Mass in Cleethorpes Tue 15th 9.30 am Mass in Grimsby 11.30 am Mass in Immingham

The Vigil Mass will be preceded by Eucharistic Adoration at 6.15 pm with Benediction at 6.45 pm. Our Lady, untouched by any stain of sin by God's prevenient grace, which we celebrate as her Immaculate Conception, was assumed body and soul into heaven at the end of the course of her natural life here on earth: we ask for her prayers that we, who in Baptism died with Christ and rose with him to new life, may safeguard the grace of our Baptism, so that we too may share with him in eternal glory. We 'look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come', and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary expresses our faith that the Resurrection of Jesus is the first fruits of the resurrection for which we all hope and in which Our Lady already fully shares.

Sr Breege Leddy CSJP died peacefully on 1st June 2020, in the seventieth year of religious life. Many of those years were spent here in our parish, and many remember her smile, laugh and kindness, together with her involvement in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and First Holy Communion preparation, and of course, her wonderful work in visiting the sick in hospital and at home. At the time of her Funeral, I said that we would celebrate a **Memorial Mass** for her in our parish in due course: this Mass will be celebrated in **Corpus Christi Church** on **Friday 11th August at 11.00 am** to which all are welcome, and Mass will be followed by refreshments in Holy Trinity Parish Hall. Thank you to everyone who came to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in Corpus Christi Church last Sunday, and to those who organised the liturgy and refreshments in Holy Trinity Parish Hall. The next celebration will be on Sunday 11th February 2024, the World Day of the Sick, which is observed each year on 11th February, the day on which St Bernadette first saw Our Lady in the Grotto of Massabielle in Lourdes in 1858, a day of 'prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ', as St John Paul II wrote in 1992.

Anyone can, and should, be anointed if they are burdened by any form of illness, whether mental or physical, acute or chronic, are anxious or facing crises in their lives, families and relationships, must undergo surgery, feel the pain of loss or bereavement, or are suffering in any way and are moved in prayer to be anointed. **The Sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation can always be celebrated** at the times indicated opposite, during Friday Open House, before Mass and after Mass, by appointment, and at call in St Mary's Presbytery. We should all avail ourselves of every opportunity to receive the Sacraments, in which God, in his goodness and wisdom, walks with us on the journey of life and blesses every aspect of our lives and our relationships here on earth.
