Annual Parish Meeting – 5<sup>th</sup> October 2023: Our annual parish meeting will begin with the celebration of Mass in Corpus Christi Church at 6.00 pm on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October, and after Mass will continue in Holy Trinity Parish Hall with tea and coffee, the presentation of the summary of the accounts for the last financial year, and a reflection on where we are as a parish and where we are heading in accordance with our Vision. **Journey in Faith – 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023:** Anyone who is interested in becoming a Catholic, or anyone, Catholic or non-Catholic, who wishes to learn more about the Catholic Faith, is welcome to gather in St Mary's Presbytery on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> October after 7.00 pm Mass.
