**Cycle of Prayer:** During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

**Film Night – 19<sup>th</sup> October 2023:** *The Letter, A Message for Our Earth* is a 2022 documentary film telling the story of our Holy Father Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter on care for our common home *Laudato si'*, published in 2015, in which environmental champions from around the world, from different faiths and worldviews, journey from the Amazon, India, Senegal and Hawai'i to the Vatican, where they meet the Pope, who shares his vision with them, so that they can find hope for the Earth in one another. We will have the opportunity to watch it in Holy Trinity Parish Hall this Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> October, at 7.00 pm. All are welcome and there is no charge – tea and coffee will be available, and please bring your own popcorn!

**Marriage is a lifelong vocation** of a man and a woman to a community of life and love open to children, and, between the baptised, it is a sacrament. Aware of the many pressures today which can endanger family life, the Church is constantly concerned to make sure that those of you planning to marry

are prepared as well as possible. I would like to remind those who wish to marry of the following. It is important that a couple see me in good time, giving at least six months' notice before their proposed wedding date, so that marriage preparation can be arranged and carried out in our parish, including online or in person sessions with Marriage Care. Catholics are reminded of their obligation to preserve their faith and to do all they can within the unity of their partnership to have all their children baptised and brought up in the faith and practice of the Catholic Church; non-Catholic partners will be informed of this promise, but they are not asked to make this or any similar promise. Dispensation for a marriage between a Catholic and a non-Catholic to take place in a non-Catholic church can only be granted for a serious reason: couples who wish to marry in a non-Catholic church should discuss the matter with me in good time before their wedding to see whether a dispensation could be granted. Similarly, those who are in an irregular situation, such as being civilly married but not married in accordance with the teaching and law of the Church, should see me to see what can be done to enable them to receive the sacraments, including the Blessed Eucharist in Holy Communion.

All couples who intend to marry need the support of their parish, to be strengthened in their preparation for marriage, in celebrating their marriage, and in living out their covenant with one another, and I would like to thank all those married people who show such constancy and fidelity to their vocation of marriage, and I hope that their example will inspire all who are planning to marry.
