Special Collection for the Holy Land – 5th November: There will be a special collection at each Mass this weekend to

support Caritas Jerusalem's relief efforts in the Holy Land. The terrible situation in Israel and occupied Palestinian territory is tearing lives apart. Your donation will help to provide urgent, practical help to the families who need it in Gaza, Christian and non-Christian alike, which is served by the Catholic Parish of the Holy Family, in Gaza City, in the Patriarchate of Jerusalem, the Diocese, which includes Cyprus, the Holy Land and Jordan, as soon as it is safe for humanitarian aid workers to enter Gaza.

Collectors will be holding baskets as we leave Mass today; alternatively, put your offering in an envelope clearly marked 'Gaza' and put it in the offertory collection box or hand it to a steward – this can be done at any time and your offering will be forwarded. Please give by cash, cheques payable to 'Holy Trinity GCI RCP', or use contactless giving by pressing 'Gaza'.

Our offering will be processed by CAFOD, so that UK taxpayers can give their offering using Gift Aid. Please complete a Gift Aid Declaration if you can, as this boosts your offering at no extra cost to you, making an offering of £10.00 worth £12.50. To do so, just collect a CAFOD envelope from the stewards complete the declaration, place your offering, and put it in the collection boxes or the baskets. You can also make your offering at **cafod.org.uk** at any time, where you can also give your offering by Gift Aid.

Thank you for your generous support those in distress. Let us continue to pray for the release of hostages the cessation of violence, and a just peace for all who live in the Holy Land. As our Holy Father Pope Francis said at the *Angelus Domini* in St Peter's Square last Sunday, 'In Gaza, may space be opened to guarantee humanitarian aid, and may the hostages be released right away. Let no one abandon the possibility that the weapons might be silenced – let there be a ceasefire.'

May our Blessed Lady, Daughter of Israel and Queen of Palestine, pray for all in her homeland, and may our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, whose Body broken and Blood poured out is our resurrection and life, bless the people of Gaza and the wider Holy Land by his Real Presence in their midst and raise them up to a new hope so that all may flourish, 'for God wanted all perfection to be found through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by hid death on the Cross' (Colossians 1:19-20). The Synod of Bishops has prepared a synthesis report, A Synodal Church in Mission, which is in three parts, 'The Face of the Synodal Church', 'All Disciples, All Missionaries' and 'Weaving Bonds, Building Communities'. The Synod is a listening process, a conversation in the Holy Spirit, and the report looks at convergences, points for further consideration and proposals. Copies have been emailed to everyone on the mailing list, are available for all those who wish to receive one, by email or paper copy, from the parish office and which can be downloaded at synod.va. The first session of the sixteenth ordinary general assembly concluded last Sunday in St Peter's Basilica, and the second session will meet in Rome next year. At the Closing Mass, the Pope said: 'Today we do not see the full fruit of this process, but with farsightedness we look to the horizon opening up before us. The Lord will guide us and help

us to be a more synodal and missionary Church, a Church that adores God and serves the women and men of our time, going

forth to bring to everyone the consoling joy of the Gospel.'
