Do we make room for Jesus in the manger of our hearts or are we so busy partying that we do not see him in the hungry, thirsty, naked, stranger, sick and imprisoned? Food for thought...

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for December, the Month of the Divine Infancy: We pray that people living with disabilities may be at the centre of attention in society, and that institutions may offer inclusive programs which value their active participation.

Cycle of Prayer: During the Seasons of Advent and Christmas, we pray for: openness to the Word of God; migrants and refugees; and expectant mothers. We also pray for the sick and housebound, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Everyone is welcome to come in for free during these times, with tea and coffee available for all who wish!

Admission to Hospital: All those who are admitted to hospital or who are ill at home or in another care setting – whatever the illness, whether it is chronic or acute, mental or physical – or who have anxieties or who are preparing for serious surgery should be anointed. The Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick can be received at any time, at the times listed opposite, by appointment via the parish office (01472 342301 / office@holytrinitygci.uk), and also, if I am available, before and after Mass, during Friday Open House and at call in St Mary's Presbytery. To ensure that I can visit you so that you can receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Communion:

- If you or a relative are in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, please ask a nurse to contact the hospital chaplaincy and ask for me to visit. If you contact St Mary's Presbytery directly, please have the patient's consent to do so, and provide us with their date of birth and address, and which ward they are on; contact for a patient in A&E should always be via the nurse.
- If you or a relative are in Scunthorpe General Hospital, Castle Hill Hospital or another hospital, please ask a nurse to contact the chaplaincy and ask for the Catholic chaplain to visit – you can contact the parish office if you need assistance with this, as we can help.
- If you or a relative are in other care settings, such as St Andrew's Hospice or a nursing or residential home, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office.
- if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office.

In case of serious illness, please do not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit them in time – I will come on any day of the week at any time of the day or night as necessary; similarly, please do not wait until someone is feeling better! It is never too early to receive the sacraments, in which Jesus walks with us in the circumstances in which we find ourselves, and so we should avail ourselves of God's gracious help at every possible opportunity Fr Andrew
