I am delighted that from February, our sisters will be celebrating Sunday Mass in St Mary on the Sea Church and Our Lady Star of the Sea Church as well as in Corpus Christi Church, as this will promote and enhance the Sisters' presence and their Congregation's charism throughout the whole parish in a year when we will celebrate Sr Bridgetta's Diamond Jubilee of Profession and, belatedly because of the pandemic, Sr Ann Helen's Golden Jubilee. It will be good for everyone to see our sisters on a regular basis, and not just those who attend Sunday Mass in Corpus Christi Church! Fr Andrew

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord – 2nd February 2024: Our Cribs and decorations remain in place until this beautiful feast, also called Candlemas, which means that today is the last Sunday on which we can pray before the Crib. Please visit the Crib as you leave Mass today, and please leave your offerings for the Friends of the Holy Land, who help Christians in Our

Lord's homeland and who we will also be supporting with our Lenten alms this year, in the baskets near the Cribs. I am grateful to everyone for your generosity not only to this charity, but also to all the other charities which we support.

Mass on Candlemas will begin with the **Blessing of Candles**, which can then be taken home after Mass to remind us, as the African American civil rights leader Howard Thomas (1899-1981) puts it in his poem, that the work is only beginning:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and the princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flock, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among brothers, to make music in the heart.

As Christmastide ends and we turn our minds and hearts towards the Season of Lent, which begins on **Ash Wednesday**, **14**th **February**, let us continue to pray and think about how we live our Baptism, when we were given the flame of faith to be kept burning brightly, and in the light of our faith, what we are going to **focus on in Lent**, in prayer, **take on for Lent**, in almsgiving and **give up for Lent**, in fasting. 'Hear us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, for we have sinned against you.' There will be more information next Sunday about Ash Wednesday on various parish and other initiatives to help us to live Lent in the Prophetic Mission in fasting, the Priestly Mission in Prayer and the Kingly Mission in almsgiving.
