**Lent** began on Ash Wednesday and continues until Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024; this is a joyful season in which we reflect on our lives and relationships with God in prayer, with others in almsgiving and within ourselves in fasting, so that we will be 'overcome with paschal joy' when we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus the Christ, who described himself as 'resurrection and life':

- Our theme for Lent and Easter this year is 'Open our hearts and our minds', words taken from our parish prayer.
   During Lent, let us try to see, hear, think, feel and speak as Jesus, so that by being like him in everything that we have, do and are, we may truly feel his presence in our lives and be his presence in the lives of others as we proclaim, celebrate and build the Kingdom of God.
- If you did not pick up this year's Lent Leaflet, which lists everything that we are doing in our parish this Lent together with other ideas for living this 'sacred time for the renewing and purifying' of our hearts, please take one home today.
- Beginning this Sunday, we will have Eucharistic Adoration for half an hour before each of our Sunday Masses, concluding with Benediction a few minutes before Mass, and also each Wednesday before evening Mass and each Saturday at 10.00 am. The Church teaches that prayer before Christ the Lord sacramentally present in the Blessed Eucharist 'renews the covenant which in turn moves them to maintain in their lives what they have received by faith and by sacraments. They should try to lead their whole lives with the strength derived from the heavenly food, as they share in the death and resurrection

of the Lord. Everyone should be concerned with good deeds and with pleasing God so that they may imbue the world with the Christian spirit and be a witness of Christ in the world in which we live. During Mass, we do not sing the *Gloria* nor during Holy Communion to help us think differently, reflecting on who we are and what we are about as the disciples of Christ – let us truly live Sunday Mass as the 'source and summit' of our lives as Christians.

- Beginning today, Lenten Breakfasts will be held in Holy Trinity Parish Hall after 9.00 am Mass on Sundays in Lent, and in St Mary on the Sea Church after 11.00 am Mass.
- This year, our Lenten Alms will support the Friends of the Holy Land, who we supported with our Crib offerings, as the need of Christians in the Holy Land is great, particularly in the Parish of the Holy Family in Gaza, where our siblings' faith is admirable and exemplary; your offerings can be left in the baskets next to the Altar in our churches.

The Rite of Election – 18<sup>th</sup> February 2024: Celebrated in St Barnabas' Cathedral on the First Sunday of Lent each year, the Rite of Election gives Bishop Patrick the opportunity of meeting all who will be baptised or received into the full communion of the Catholic Church during the following year, usually during the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night.
