**Papal Blessings Parchments** can be requested for the celebrations of Baptism, Confirmation, First Holy Communion, Marriage, Ordination, 10<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, 40<sup>th</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup>, 65<sup>th</sup>, 70<sup>th</sup>, 75<sup>th</sup> & 80<sup>th</sup> wedding & Ordination anniversaries and 18<sup>th</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup>, 70<sup>th</sup>, 80<sup>th</sup>, 90<sup>th</sup> & 100<sup>th</sup> birthdays. Please see Fr Andrew if you would like to request a papal blessing parchment for yourself or another person.

The Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick can be received at any time, and should be received by those who are ill — whatever the illness, chronic or acute, mental or physical — or who are preparing for serious surgery. To arrange for me to visit you:

 If you or a relative are in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, please ask a nurse to ask switchboard to contact the chaplaincy and ask for me to visit. If you contact St Mary's Presbytery directly, please have the patient's consent to do so, and provide us with their date of birth and/or address, and which ward they are on; contact for a patient in A&E should always be via the nurse.

- If you or a relative are in other care settings, such as St Andrew's Hospice or a nursing or residential home, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk).
- if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk).

In case of serious illness, please do not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit them in time; similarly, please do not wait until someone is feeling better! All seven sacraments are for the living: Confirmation and the Blessed Eucharist strengthen and renew our Baptism, Holy Orders and Matrimony are sacraments of vocation, and the Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation are sacraments of healing. It is never too early to receive the sacraments, which are God's gracious help for us in the circumstances in which we find ourselves so we should avail ourselves of them. Fr Andrew

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord – 8<sup>th</sup> April 2024: This great solemnity, which celebrates the Word becoming flesh and dwelling among us, is usually celebrated on 25<sup>th</sup> March. This year, because of the date of Easter, we will celebrate Mary's 'yes' this Monday, 8<sup>th</sup> April, with Eucharistic Adoration in St Mary on the Sea Church at 5.45 pm and Mass at 6.30 pm. Mgr David Hogan, a priest of the Diocese of Middlesbrough, will preach the Homily. All are welcome!

**Thank you** to everyone, from across our parish and beyond, who gathered in person and online to celebrate the Sacred Paschal Triduum, and to all who exercised the various ministries which helped make the liturgies and our churches so beautiful, welcoming and engaging for everyone.

Each of the celebrations of the Sacred Paschal Triduum is very different, with the intimacy of Maundy Thursday, and the procession to the Altar of Repose as we walk with Jesus from the Upper Room to Gethsemane, leading to the starkness of Good Friday, in which we all have our moment, each of us in our own way, before the Holy Cross, before we 'shake with joy' at the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, gathered around the Easter fire to spread light in darkness, to begin our celebration of the Resurrection, the focal point of all time and space.

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night is not just the climactic moment of the Sacred Paschal Triduum, but of the whole of our annual living of our Christian faith, which does not make sense without it, and this year it was a real joy for us to celebrate the Easter Vigil with Fr Krzysztof and our siblings n the Polish Parish of St Maximilian Kolbe, Scunthorpe, Lincoln and Grimsby, a true 'Pentecost moment' for both parishes, joined together in unity and peace.

I am grateful to everyone who has sent me Easter cards and presents, and who contributed so generously to the Easter Offering, which forms part of my taxable income each year.

I pray most sincerely that our celebration of the Sacred Paschal Triduum will open our hearts and our minds, for we are an Easter People and 'Alleluia' is our song! Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Happy Easter — and the fifty-day Season of Easter has only just begun! Fr Andrew
