
# Sunday JAPA Most Holy Body and Blood of CHRIST

### THE WORD

Year B • 2 June 2024 • Psalter Week 1



# Today's feast doesn't commemorate any particular event in Jesus' life, but is a celebration of his gift of the Eucharist. The traditional day for this feast is the Thursday after Trinity Sunday.

The reason Thursday is chosen is because Jesus celebrated the Last Supper on the Thursday before he died when he gifted his disciples with the Eucharist during the Passover meal. Many local churches have moved the celebration to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. The churches in the UK and Ireland follow this practice.

In today's Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus about his plans to celebrate the Passover meal. Jesus sends two of them into the city and tells them what they are to do. Normally, the Passover meal would be celebrated by a Jewish family. However, Jesus is not going to celebrate this meal with his blood relatives but with his "new family" of disciples. When the disciples go into the city, everything happens as Jesus foretold and they make the preparations.

Later that evening, during the meal, Jesus speaks words about his death over the bread and wine. Following the Jewish custom at Passover, Jesus blesses God for the gift of food and then breaks the bread and gives a piece to all present with the words, "Take it, this is my body." The broken bread he shares with the disciples is his body broken in death for others. Those who eat this bread are now connected to him in the most profound way.

He does the same with the cup and adds, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many." The Jews understood that the covenant made between God and Israel at Mount Sinai had been sealed in animals' blood. Blood symbolised life and since the Sinai covenant was sealed in blood, it meant that Israel then shared in God's very own life. Jesus now offers us an eternal, life-giving New Covenant, sealed in his very own blood.

### REFLECT

t's easy to lose our sense of wonder, to live in a world of the mundane. Every day I follow the same route on my early morning walk. I know the terrain like the back of my hand, and so don't pay much attention to what's going on around me as I listen to a book on Audible. My route takes me past Limerick's famous King John's castle. One morning last year saw a glorious red sky as the sun rose majestically behind the castle. I didn't pay it much attention. It was just another sunrise, until a man standing behind a tripod commanded me to stop. He had been taking photographs of the castle framed against the crimson sky. "Stop, stop, you gotta stop and look at this," he said, pointing towards the castle. "It's gorgeous; you need to take it in." And I did. I took out my AirPods and stood with him for several minutes gazing at the awesome sight before our eyes. And I expressed my gratitude to

him for forcing me to stop and look and marvel. My morning walk had become so routine, so quotidian, that I didn't appreciate what was going on around me. I try not to make that mistake now.

Repetition dulls excitement. Doing more or less the same thing every day, we can fall into a rut and lose our capacity for awe, for wonder.

It's the same when it comes to the Eucharist. If we go to Mass regularly, we know what to expect. The readings will differ each time, and hopefully the homily will be original and engaging, but otherwise there is a sameness to the celebration: the same consecration, the same holy communion, the same words, the same gestures. It becomes so routine, so predictable, that we can lose our sense of awe, of wonder, at what is taking place. We fail to marvel at the

miracle unfolding among us, the gift of the body and blood of Christ given to us out of love.

In one sense, today's feast may seem superfluous. After all, every Eucharist is a feast of the body and blood of Christ. What we celebrate today, we celebrate every time we come to Mass. But precisely because we are so used to it, occasionally we need a little jolt, a nudge, as I was given on my morning walk, to remind us to look more closely at what is happening, to stop and appreciate more fully what it is we are celebrating, to be amazed at the event unfolding, awestruck at the gift we are receiving. As you receive the Lord in holy communion today, let this feast be a reminder to you to be, in the words of St Thomas Aquinas, "lost, all lost in wonder at the God thou art."



Dear fellow Parishioners,

I have been asked by Father Andrew to write to you all, on his behalf.

First of all, he wishes us all a very happy patronal feast day of our Parish of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity, Grimsby, Cleethorpes and Immingham, the biggest and best parish in this, our Diocese of Nottingham. And he also extends his immense gratitude to Bishop Patrick for Celebrating Mass this weekend and for his continued support of his ministry here in our parish.

Second, This Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2024 Father Andrew was taken into hospital where he has undergone examinations and tests and has now been discharged. He will continue to recover away from the presbytery, so that the parish office and parish rooms may continue to function without disrupting his recovery over the coming weeks.

Third, In the meantime, the usual weekday liturgical schedule will be maintained with Celebrations of Word and Holy Communion in the place of Mass. If you have an appointment with Father Andrew, I will be contacting you to cancel this, and will rearrange this as soon as Father Andrew is able to return to parish ministry.

Fourth, To receive the sacrament of the anointing of the sick or reconciliation please do contact the parish office in the usual way, and I will arrange for a Priest from one of our neighbouring Parishes to visit you. Or if in danger of death please do still ring Father Andrew himself, and he will ensure I arrange for a Priest from one of our neighbouring Parishes to visit you.

Fifth, this week has made all but too clear the impact that all of our Parish Priests' unconditional, unrelenting, selfless and dedicated service, can have on their health. Father Andrew has been told that from September of this year, there will be more retired Priests in this, our Diocese of Nottingham than those still in Public Ministry, so their responsibilities will only increase further. Father Andrew has spoken repeatedly, of our co-responsibility for the Church, rooted in our baptismal mission of Prophet, Priest and King. I ask you to consider even the small ways you can help support the functioning of our Parish going forward and please do speak to me if you would like to help, but are unsure about how to.

Ours is a large Parish, and a busy Parish. Perhaps the busiest, biggest and best, is a more accurate tagline moving forward. We are a parish I am extremely proud to serve, but if we are to continue to be the Parish we have been made and called to be, then we all must play our part in the coming months and years to ensure that all, including our Priests, are valued in the name of Jesus the Christ, and continue to flourish.

Lastly, and most importantly, Father Andrew cannot thank you all enough for your prayers and well wishes. He looks forward to returning to serving our Parish which he loves so much, as soon as he possibly can. He assures us all of his continued prayers.

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, "Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?" So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, 'The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?' He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.




